

12. Habitat Detective, Take Two -

Which habitat type is established
on the left side of the road?

Here's another habitat challenge for you. By now you may be able to recognize the habitat type on the left side of the road. The answer is at the bottom of this page.

Think about the habitat identification clues:

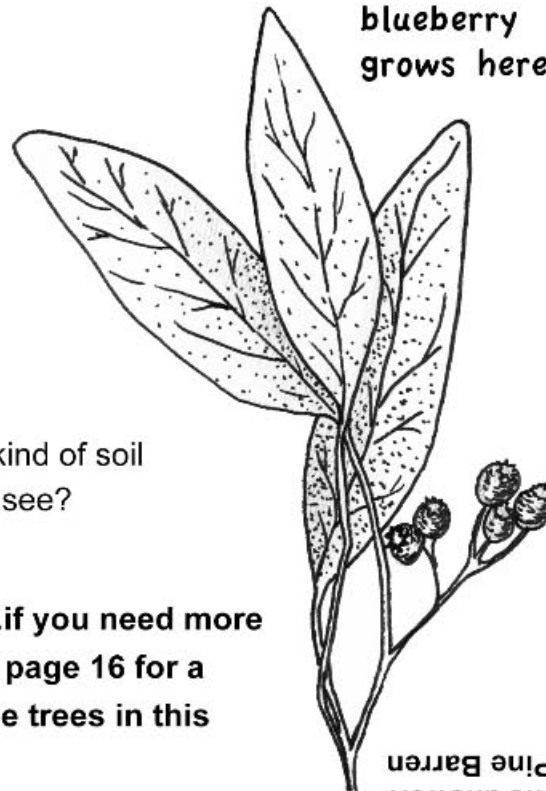
⇒ Do you recognize any of the tree species?

⇒ What is the slope of the land like?

⇒ What kind of soil do you see?

► *Continue along, passing Brown Road on your right.*



**A stand of sassafras trees
(*Sassafras albidum*) can be
seen just beyond
Brown Road on the right.
This wetland species has
three distinct leaf shapes on
each tree. See if you can
find all three.**

► *As you approach the T-Wharf Road you'll pass the large
Quonset hut on your left. The next stop is right across from the
Quonset hut. The distance to Stop #13 is 525 feet (160 m).*

The answer: Forested Wetland and the red maple tree.
